August 17

- Anthony Lake, Executive Director of UNICEF was the Keynote Speaker for the opening ceremony which also featured the Eagle Song Dancers, Vancouver Children's Choir, Chibi Taiko Drummers and welcome addresses by IPA President Andreas Konstantopoulos and CPS President Jonathan Kronick.

August 18

- Meet the experts Tony Barozzino and Chuck Hui addressed issues and barriers faced by immigrant children and highlight the utility of the "Caring for Kids New to Canada" resource.
- At the morning plenary, Richard Horton and Zulfiqar Bhutta set out a manifesto for child health and shared how pediatricians can contribute to these global goals!
- A discussion of current thinking and practice related to chronic pain was presented at the morning concurrent session titled Pain Management in Children and Adolescents.

- The morning plenary featured speakers James Perrin, Olayinka Omigbodun and Ian Manion as they introduced a new understanding of epidemiology of child mental health.
- Margaret Fisher, Paul Koki Ndombo and Dorothy Esangbedo focused on the epidemiology, diagnosis and management of infections in children at the Ebola and Emerging Infections
- How can pediatricians provide a better understanding of injury prevention to reduce death and health costs? Attendees heard from panel of speakers at the Injury Prevention and Safety Concurrent Session.
- At the afternoon plenary, speakers Mickey Chopra and Aluisio Borros discussed a world free of list infections and indicated the intervention in assessing coverage and equity for child health everywhere.

August 22
